Complete coverage for Albemarle County of high-resolution land cover map

**5. What’s Ahead: Rivanna Watershed Planning Effort**

- Chesapeake Bay TMDL – “Rivanna-regional” pilot project to develop stakeholder engagement process at the local level for the Watershed Implementation
- TAC focus on components of a Watershed Plan for the Rivanna especially assessing the data we have and interpreting Land Cover Map to identify priority conservation goals
- Staff focus on using watershed planning process to coordinate with RRBC efforts, targeting grant opportunities, and identifying priority goals
