4. Land Cover Map

Complete coverage for Rivanna localities – complementary with Charlottesville GIS
capability (high-resolution land cover map)

5. What’s Ahead?

- TAC will focus on components of a Watershed Plan for the Rivanna
especially assessing the data we have and interpreting Land Cover Map
to identify priority conservation goals
- Chesapeake Bay TMDL – “Rivanna-regional” pilot project to develop stakeholder
engagement process at the local level for the Watershed Implementation Plans
- Staff focus on using watershed planning process to coordinate with RRBC efforts,
targeting grant opportunities, and identifying priority goals
