### **Keep up with Stormwater and NPS**

**NPSINFO** is EPA's electronic mailing list for discussing nonpoint source pollution (NPS) control issues. NPS pollution is the nation's largest remaining water quality problem—and a community of more than 1,700 individuals from federal, state, and local government and numerous public and private organizations uses NPSINFO to share information on how to address this problem. NPSINFO is a public forum for open discussion of runoff pollution issues, including unregulated nonpoint source (NPS) pollution and regulated stormwater. The range of topics that are appropriate for discussing on NPSINFO include: agricultural runoff, urban runoff, watershed planning, management, and restoration, hydrologic modification, aquatic habitat modification, NPS

pollution prevention, NPS/stormwater education and outreach, funding for NPS/stormwater control, and technology options for controlling NPS pollution.
