



## Group Seeks Stormwater Support

The Rivanna River Basin Commission is asking counties along the river to support water conservation by catching stormwater.

The commission says people have expressed the cleanliness and condition of the Rivanna River as one of the top environmental priorities in the area.

Albemarle, Fluvanna, and Greene counties, and the city of Charlottesville are working to upgrade government buildings to fit within the best management practices of stormwater control.



"We're saving water; we're making sure that it doesn't flow rapidly into the Rivanna and destroy it further and provide more sedimentation to destroy the river," said Marvin Moss with the commission. "Then we're putting it to practical use."

The commission says building projects like Fluvanna County's new high school will have some of the most advanced stormwater management in the state.
