Fluvanna's Moss to lead river commission

The Rivanna River Basin Commission has elected Fluvanna County Supervisor Marvin Moss as its new chairman.

Moss has served as vice chairman since the commission's inception in 2007. He will replace Sally H. Thomas, an Albemarle County supervisor who will leave the commission at the end of the year.

Roberta "Robbi" Savage, the citizen representative to the Commission from Greene County, has been elected vice chairwoman.

The Rivanna River Basin Commission was created in 2004. The four participating jurisdictions in the Rivanna Basin — Charlottesville, as well as Albemarle, Fluvanna and Greene counties — subsequently endorsed its creation.

The commission's purpose is to provide guidance for the stewardship and enhancement of the water and natural resources of the Rivanna River Basin.

The commission consists of 14 members including two supervisors each from Albemarle, Fluvanna and Greene counties, two Charlottesville City Council members, a representative each from the Culpeper Soil and Water Conservation District and the Thomas Jefferson Soil and Water Conservation District, as well as four citizen members appointed by the three counties and Charlottesville.
